

Professor Bin Cheng

ISPL is honoured to have as its Honorary President Professor Bin Cheng, a world authority on international air and space law. His work has had a tremendous impact on the field of aeronautics, not least through his central role in the adoption of the 1999 Montreal Convention, updating the 1929 Warsaw Convention on international air transport.

He was Professor and Dean of the Law School, UCL and taught at universities around the world. Many of his students have become professors, directors of legal institutes, policy and legal experts. Since 1990 he has continued to contribute as Emeritus Professor, and at international forums.

His many publications have been influential and arguably definitive. *General Principles of Law as Applied by International Courts and Tribunals* is the most important book on the subject (1953, reprint 2006, Cambridge University Press). *Studies in International Space Law* (1997) reprinted articles that pioneered the application of public international law to air and space activity. In retirement he is still sought out for contributions to conferences and publications.

The 2007 issue of Annals of Air and Space Law, McGill University, Canada was dedicated to Professor Cheng because scholars, decision-makers and students in Great Britain and many other countries profited from his incisive analysis of contemporary issues arising out of aeronautical and space activities.
